CLASS OF THE WEEK—5/6G

Since returning to school for the start of Term 4, several students have commented that they can't believe it's last term already. I have to say that I totally agree. The year has flown by so quickly. However Term 4 is often the busiest of the year. We have our excursion to Parliament House in Sydney to support our HSIE Unit on Government. Then there will be Surf Fun Day for the Year 6's to facilitate the development of safe practices when using the beach. There is also High School Transitions. Presentation Day and Year 6 Farewell.



In Literacy activities, the students have been looking at different forms of poetry. They are working on skills and strategies to help them to understand the layout and decode the messages that the poet is sending. The students have also been looking at some biographies of famous people. Through this, they have practiced skills at locating information from the internet and how to use that information when constructing a biography.

In Maths, the students completed a wide variety of tasks to assist them to find patterns and write rules for continuing patterns. This led us to some work involving algebra and how to use patterns and given information to solve an unknown. This week, we are working with percentages and money. We will be looking at how these work in 'real world' contexts.

This week, 5/6G had the privilege of presenting an artwork that the class developed to the Wyong Shire Council Waste Management Committee. The artwork was created by the class using recyclable waste materials—even using the box our new Smartboard was in. Several students spoke about the process at a special assembly on Tuesday this week.

WEAR A HELMET

- Check that your child wears a bicycle helmet when playing or riding on wheels—bikes, foot scooters, roller skates, skateboards or rollerblades. The helmet should be firmly buckled so it fits without wobbling or slipping to the sides. It must protect the forehead.


